






From The Vicar: The Three Days

"A new command I give you: Love one another."
As I have loved you, so you must love one another."
- John 13:34

The Three Days are truly a roller coaster of emotions covering a vast spectrum of the human experience. Humanity – both Jesus' humanity and our own – is a central theme throughout these days. Jesus shows us his humanity many times: from the way in which he washes his disciples' dirty feet to the way he instructs them to love....even to the way that he bleeds and dies is *incredibly human* of him. It's incredible in Jesus' moment of "weakness", or say, humanness, when he asks God to "remove this cup from me," making one last plea to god to spare him...ultimately, we know how the story ends.....Jesus is filled with resolve to make the sacrifice that he knows is necessary.

This sacrifice comes from a place of love, and it's a love that is at the core of everything Jesus does throughout his life. He doesn't instruct us to love ourselves or him, but he pushes us out into the community, telling us to love one another as he loves us. We are to take this love, take this example, and spread it around the world. This is the last and most important lesson we get from our earthly Jesus, and it's worth remembering each year. For that matter, EVERY DAY !!!!!

The Good Friday gospel from John almost reads like a John Grisham novel. It's filled with drama, courtroom testimonies and a conflicted prosecutor. Pilate seems almost willing to overlook the challenge to the emperor's power as he pushes for Jesus' release over that of Barabbas. Combine this with Peter's internal and external struggles, the vacillating crowd and crooked leaders, and Jesus' bloody death, and there are countless images of humanity in all forms and of how we experience the same struggles and doubts of our time.

On Good Friday, resurrected life begins to shine from the tomb. So while we focus on the resurrected Jesus, we don't have to shy away from the human experience of living out the gospel. In Mark's account we witness the understandable fear and confusion expressed by the women at the tomb as they hear the news of Jesus' rising. In this case, the good news was spread...what a joy it is to be able to carry on the task of spreading this good news from so long ago by so human a figure....."A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." Jesus..... and His Love!!!!!! Go....carry the message to ALL Humanity!!!!! We are commanded !!!!!!!

Recipe of the Month

This month's featured recipe is from Jeff Wetzel. Want to get more oats in your diet? Try this delicious pie! It tastes very much like pecan pie but has no nuts, so it's good for anyone with a nut allergy.

Oatmeal Pie

INGREDIENTS:

3/4 cup sugar

1 stick butter, softened

2 beaten eggs

3/4 cup dark corn syrup

3/4 cup quick oats

1/2 cup coconut

Unbaked pie shell

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. Cream together sugar and butter.
- 2. Add eggs, corn syrup, oats, and coconut.
- 3. Mix well and pour into pie shell.
- 4. Bake for 45 minutes at 350°.

Editor's Note: I had never heard of Oatmeal Pie so I did some google research. The origins of this pie are not certain, some think that it originates from the Amish community, others feel that the recipe was created in the south during the Civil War. Pecans were expensive or hard to find in that time period.

Instead of granulated sugar, some recipes use light brown sugar to add flavor, some use dark brown sugar to give it a more molasses taste. Some recipes add vanilla, cinnamon, and salt for added flavor. Some call for coconut, others do not. They all use quick oats for the texture and because they are thinly rolled and will best absorb the filling liquid. Also, quick oats are easier to eat.

Tip: Be sure to let the pie cool completely before cutting, it needs time to set up or it will be runny. It is delicious served with a scoop of vanilla ice cream!







Faith and the Upcoming Elections

The nation's increasingly combative political polarization is partly fueled by the tension between "red state" and "blue state" forms of Christianity. Join Dr. Lee Barrett as we explore the visceral spiritual hungers and fears that motivate each of these factions and consider possible ways to promote a less belligerent conversation.

Dr. Barrett is the Chair in Theology and Professor of Systematic Theology at Lancaster Theological Seminary. He holds a BA, MDiv, MA, and PhD, all from Yale University.
