#### From The Vicar:

#### "and his name shall be called Emmanuel"

- Matt. 1:23

Every January 1 my *Prayer Book For and By the Church* begins with "THE NAME OF JESUS". Just that way; **BIG BOLD LETTERS**. And why not? **It IS** the most noteworthy name ever. So much so, that the world changed its point of dating recorded history.

So, what does the name mean? It means helper, deliverer, rescuer, savior. And given to this Child, the name signifies a special kind of helper. It tells us that Jesus came for a very special kind of work. "He will save His people from their sins." We have rulers and governments to protect us from the lawless, fathers and mothers to nurture and protect little children, doctors to advise and help us in time of sickness, and judges to protect us against illegal loss. But none of these can save us from sin. Not even an angel can do that. Only He, whose birthday we commemorated 8 days ago and whose name is Jesus can save us from our sins.

The prophet Isaiah gave Him other names: "Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." Beautiful names!!!! But they are meaningful only because of this name Jesus. Every other name by which He is called is precious only because "He will save His people from their sins." Jesus was a descendant of Abraham. He was the Seed of Abraham through whom all the nations of the earth would be blessed. Therefore, by circumcision He was put under the Law and thus began His active obedience to the Law on our behalf. He rendered obedience to God's law as He began life here on earth. He lived and died in obedience. And why? It was for us, who are so disobedient, who exalt ourselves against God's law and insist on having our own way. It was for us.

Of course the power of the name (of Jesus) is not in the mere pronouncing of it or in five letters of the alphabet that spell Jesus. There's no peculiar magic about this name. The power of it lies in the Person who bears it, Jesus, the mighty God, Emmanuel, God with us. To those who know this name and believe in Him whose name it is, to them, all the rich implication of it are made available. To those who trust in this name, the whole grace of God comes to give them strength to live for Him. In His name, we can live up to His name. That's why we're called Christian. That precious name stands as a constant reminder that He is the Lord of our life. In The Name Of Jesus. Amen.

# **Recipe of the Month**

This month's feature recipe was submitted by Janice Clemmer. She talked about this recipe at our Social Ministry Committee's Sewing Group session. You make it in a Crock-pot and it sounded delicious. I suggested we include it in the newsletter to share it with everyone!

#### **Chicken Cacciatore**

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

2 medium onions, thinly sliced

2&1/2 – 3 lb. broiler fryer chicken, cut up

2 cloves garlic, minced

1 1-lb. can tomatoes

1 8-oz. can tomato sauce

1 t. salt 1/4 t. pepper

1 - 2 t. oregano leaves, crushed

1/2 t. celery seed (optional)

1/4 C. dry white wine



1/2 t. basil, crushed

1 bay leaf

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

Place sliced onions in bottom of Crock-pot.

Add chicken pieces, minced garlic, tomatoes, tomato sauce, salt, pepper, herbs and white wine.

Cover and cook on low for 6 to 8 hours. (High: 2&1/2 to 4 hours)

Serve chicken pieces with sauce over hot buttered spaghetti or vermicelli.

This recipe may be doubled for a 5-quart Crock-pot.

NOTE: Per Janice you can substitute Dry Vermuth for the wine, or eliminate it altogether.
