"For everyone to whom much is given, from him much will be required"
- Luke 12:48

We live our lives on such different levels, with varying capacities and different talents, that sometimes one is left bewildered and confused. Some are rich and some are poor. Some are intellectually brilliant, and some are mentally dull. Some have a great capacity for friendship and some are anti-social. Some have super strength and some are frail. There is successful stewardship of our advantages. There are only two attitudes you can take toward your advantages. First, you may think of them in terms of ownership. What you have is yours. No one can tell you how to handle them. Second, the Christian faith points to a second philosophy. What you have is not your own. You are accountable to others than yourself for your gifts.

Successful stewardship of our strengths requires that we never lose sight of the fact that whatever we have is a trust. God made certain investments in us. Let us therefore determine to "Pay with something fine my debt to God for life divine."

There are so many who do not glorify God, who do not give thanks. The substitutes for God are many. We can very easily fall prey, investing so little thought, time or money in holy things. We must ask ourselves, do we truly express gratitude to God?

Oh, yes, we may observe Thanksgiving each year, but do we truly give thanks for the advantages we have, the talents we have, the time and money we have?

Remember...it is possible to honor God with our lips....and have our hearts far from him..... For everyone to whom much is given, from him much will be required.....Thanks be to God!!!!!

Committee Corner

Finance Committee: Chairperson: Lindsay Collins 484-824-2379 email gidget726@msn.com. The Treasurer is the chairperson by default. Any member of the committee can assume this role, especially if experienced with investments. The Finance Committee is responsible for the financial investments and security of Mt. Zion. We meet to discuss the investment portfolio with Thrivent's investment strategist and decide if any changes are needed. We meet to develop and approve a budget for next fiscal year for operating and non-operating to propose to the council for the congregation. Averaging 3-4 times per year, each meeting lasts less than 2 hours. The treasurer is responsible for organizing the meetings. The treasurer is responsible for keeping track of the income and expenses for all accounts. This requires a few hours each week. A monthly report is presented to the council with any recommendations for changes or highlights of major financial events.

<u>Stewardship Committee:</u> Co-chairs Diane Gaumer and Diane German. We will work on Church envelopes as soon as they arrive back. It will take an afternoon. Also will do Time & Talent in January or February.

Worship & Music Committee: Chairperson and contact information: MARCIA GREEN 484-241-6345. Short description of some of the things you do: We meet every other month at 6:30pm. During our meeting we plan our church calendar for two months out. Eg: Baptisms, First Communion, Confirmation, Communion, Advent, Christmas and Easter. Plan out the special holidays and different events. Decorating the church for holiday's - Praise Band - Oversee the Alter Guild - Worship Assistants, Communion Assistants, Ushers and Greeters. Flowers and Gifts for Christmas and Easter (for the Kids). And Pot Luck Picnic, Harvest Home, and SOUPer Bowl.

Meeting generally lasts about an hour unless there is a lot of planning. Other events do not take all that much time BUT many hands make light work.

<u>Christian Education Committee:</u> Chairperson: Michelle Fegely email michellefegely@gmail.com. Oversees, creates and guides the congregation's ministries of Christian education for all ages and includes youth enrichment. The committee meets at least twice a year (meeting is 1-1.5 hours) and has additional ad-hoc preparation and/or meetings for various planning.

Elementary Sunday School – Pre-school (starting age 3) through Sixth Grade – Michelle Fegely

First Communion (5th Grade) – Vicar Heydt Confirmation (7th and 8th Grade - ages 12-13) – Michelle Batz Youth Group (those Confirmed and up) – Michelle Batz Adult ("Wired Word") – Vicar Heydt

<u>Social Ministry:</u> Chairperson and contact information: Janice Clemmer email bass134@ptd.net. Plan outreach events and projects. Including the Windy Hill Community Garden & the Women's sewing group, the Veterans Honor Garden.

Meetings are only about 1 hour or less. Usually we try to have meetings prior to church service or when there might be another meeting that the same committee members must attend. Additional time required when there is an event or project activity. Sewing group meets 3rd Tuesday of the month (except for the summer) from 9am to 2pm, if someone must leave earlier that is fine too. Usually, sewers bring a bagged lunch if they plan to stay until 2pm.

Local Shared Outreach: Chairperson: Sharon Billger 610-682-7038 email nighthawk2@dejazzd.com. Our group meets most months, we take off the summer months and usually January. We are all about reaching out to show God's love to others. We are a shared ministry with New Jerusalem Zion UCC and Friedens Lutheran churches. We select the monthly focus collection items for Friend's food pantry, as well as the recipients for our Jingle Project. We hold two Free Shared Abundance Community Meals a year, spring and fall, as well as other outreach projects such as Christmas Caroling and Labor of Love Days.

The purpose of this committee is to enhance communications between and among the Staff and the Congregation through mutual council, support and feedback of information. We currently have brought back the Pork & Sauerkraut Dinner and the Christmas Bazaar. Our committee is small so we are always in need of help for such events. We meet most 3rd Mondays of the month at 7 PM.

Recipe of the Month

This month's featured recipe was submitted by Diane Gaumer. She noted that this is a great recipe for leftover turkey at the holidays. You can use chicken for anytime you'd like to prepare it.

Turkey Rollups

INGREDIENTS:

8 oz. lasagna noodles

1 envelope (7 or 8 oz. chicken gravy mix

1 pkg. frozen chopped spinach, thawed & drained

1 can (3 or 4 oz.) mushroom stems & pieces

1/2 C. mayonnaise

2 1/2 C. finely chopped turkey

1 tsp. onion salt

1 C. shredded mozzarella cheese

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Cook noodles according to package, drain them.
- 2. Drain mushrooms saving the liquid.
- 3. Prepare gravy using mushroom juice plus enough water to make 1 1/2 C.
- 4. Stir in mayonnaise.
- 5. Combine mushrooms, turkey, spinach, onion salt, 1/2 C. mozzarella and 3/4 C. gravy mayonnaise mixture.
- 6. Spread each noodle with turkey mixture and roll up.
- 7. Place in buttered 9" x 9" pan & cover with remaining gravy mixture.
- 8. Sprinkle with remaining mozzarella.
- 9. Bake at 350° for 40 minutes. Enjoy!
